ADMINISTRATIVE DIRECTIVE NO. 801

**SUBJECT: DEPARTMENT OF POLICE SERVICES**

**I. PURPOSE**

To provide a description of the Department of Police Services (DPS) including information as to its role within Coalinga State Hospital (CSH).

**II. AUTHORITY**

California Penal Code Section 830.3(h), 830.38, and Welfare and Institutions Code Sections 4311 and 4313.

**III. POLICY**

In meeting its three-fold mission of treatment, evaluation and protection of Individuals who are judged to be a danger to the people of the State of California, CSH shall maintain a Department of Police Services.

**IV. METHOD**

- A. DPS is the local authority for the criminal investigations of criminal activity and violations upon the grounds of CSH, and shall work closely with other agencies in areas of shared jurisdiction.
- B. DPS shall be responsible for the establishment of local traffic regulations and shall be the primary traffic enforcement and traffic investigations agency on the grounds of CSH.

**V. ORGANIZATION AND ROLE**

- A. The senior law enforcement official of CSH is the Hospital Administrator.
- B. The Chief of Protective Services reports directly to the Hospital Administrator.
- C. The Chief of Protective Services shall maintain an organizational chart and other documentation within the work area of the department, detailing the roles, duties and responsibilities of each position within the department.
- D. DPS shall be responsible for establishing all security procedures of the hospital.

- E. DPS shall implement those procedures inside the security perimeter and will coordinate efforts with the Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation to implement those procedures related to the secure perimeter.
